TRAC match – July 1, 2025 – Wayne Mauler, match director

I think half of Pinal County is floating in the air in the form of dust particulate that partially blocked out the sun. Usually at this time of year, we get them in the afternoon/evening. Not today. Today is the first of July. Not sure when the weather-heads claim that monsoon season is/was supposed to start, but we could use some rain to settle the dust. Even BASF is helping with that by dragging the parking lots and range decks to scrape out the weeds, and as a result, turning the deck into a dust bowl. Isn't that convenient? We shoot air guns. The Temps today were nice and warm; 97° up to 99° with humidity right at 21%. Need a bit more humidity for rain. The winds gave us some challenges......and a whole lotta fun. East winds swinging down towards the south and shifting inside that compass quadrant.....frequently....anywhere from 9 mph to 20 mph with gusts up to 25 mph. At one point, during a "stable" wind, Bill Cole pulled his Kestrel to measure between 9 and 13 mph and shifting as fast as you can blink your eyes. So, you know what the 11 of us did to counter these conditions? We shot the match! Here are the results:

Took a 4th shot and held 4.5 mildots and nailed it! My crosshairs were off of the tail of the fish. That is how hard the wind was blowing. Talk about a curve ball! Just gotta chuckle at the stuff that is thrown at you. Of course you can't count those extra shots, but I had to see just how far off it was.

The only other noteworthy items involved resident critters at the range. During course set up, a 4-to-5-foot bull snake was seen slithering to get off the course, back by the firing line. Probably took up residence in one of the holes behind the firing line. They are welcome critters. Someone mentioned to me that Barry had taken a walk to the west end of the firing line where there is a single bush, and noted a small rattler coiled in the shade. Probably waiting for something to drink. Other than the usual lizards, these were the first sightings of the crawly critters this year, so far.
